Fire Stopping

Channel 4 is a British public service television broadcaster which began working on 2 November 1982. Although largely commercially self-funded, it is ultimately publicly owned; originally a subsidiary of the Independent Broadcasting Authority, the station is now owned and operated by the Channel Four Television Corporation, a public body established in 1990, coming into operation in 1993

Swift were called upon at Channel 4's HQ. There were various high risk integrity associated with the basement UPS battery room. This resulted in the UPS Battery room failing a Fire Integrity Test. The problem was approached with a combination of mechanical and passive fire applications.

The works were carried out by our NAPFIS qualified engineers.

A variety of passive fire stopping techniques were employed and best practice was used as a matter of course to fulfill the clients requirements.

The result being that the room integrity was brought back as required.
